Subject: MENTALLY ILL ARRESTEES

... the problem of mentally ill arrestees who may not best be housed in a county jail but end up there for a lack of a better alternative.

Background

In the late 1960s and early 1970s, the nation moved toward "deinstitutionalization" of the mentally, prodded by widely reported abuses of the mentally ill in state mental hospitals and the film "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest," which was based on events in Atascadero State Hospital in the early 1960s.

Deinstitutionalization was widely touted as the humane thing to do for the mentally ill, as saving tax dollars by closing expensive institutions and as treatment-oriented (on the theory that mental health care is better given at the local level, emphasizing outpatient care.)

In 1963, President Kennedy signed the Community Mental Health Facilities Act and "the vision was clear: the nation's 500,000 mentally ill could leave the cold cinder-block warehouses where they languished, return to their own communities and reside on their own with the assistance of local mental health agencies." (Wall Street Journal, 9/25/87).

In 1967, California enacted a similar law, though some direly predicted that "hordes of dangerously disturbed people would roam the streets and perhaps harm others." (L.A. Times 7/19/87).


RULES FOR FLIGHT


- 1. Plane on runway
