




FOCUSED ON THE PERSON AND NOT THE CRIME....



HOLISTIC DEFENSE

COMBINING AGGRESSIVE LEGAL ADVOCACY WITH ADDRESSING ANY OTHER UNDERLYING NEEDS AN INDIVIDUAL MAY HAVE. EXAMPLES MAY INCLUDE LINKING INDIVIDUALS TO MENTAL HEALTH, SUBSTANCE USE, GENERAL ASSISTANCE.....AND HOUSING

ACCORDING TO A STUDY BY RAND AND UPENN LAW,

10 YEARS OF BXD'S HOLISTIC DEFENSE



REDUCED THE RATE OF INCARCERATION

by 16%



SHORTENED SENTENCE LENGTH

by 24%



CUT PRE-TRIAL DETENTION

by 9%



Over study period, holistic defense averted 1.1 million days of custodial punishment

fewer people incarcerated each year if all NYC defendants had comparable holistic defense

Holistic defender costs \$95 million



MENTAL HEALTH DIVERSION

MHD: MENTAL HEALTH DIVERSION

- 2018 signed into law
- No plea
- Court is the gate keeper
- Started by developing a misdemeanor program using our continuum of care
- Link to mental health,substance use,

housing, supportive services



WHERE DID YOU FIND HOUSING?

Continuum of care:

- Study housing system
- DBH resources
- Partnered with Homeless
 Emergency Aid Program
 (HEAP) Funding and
 Homeless Housing,
 Assistance and Prevention

OUTCOMES:


Within one year....

Over 200 applicant for MHD

Over 100 granted

Decrease in recidivism

Decrease in the revolving door



FELONY MHD

- State offered us a grant in 2019 and 2021 to try to create a program for felony IST or likely to be IST
- State gave us three years to divert 32.5 people and 6 IST
- Had to stay in the program for at least 30 days
- Pure diversion



EMPOWER: 2021

- Collaboration of all partners
- First forensic component of care
- Mental health, substance use, SSI, Clothing, Food, social workers, transportation, groups, medication
- Funding dedicated to Housing



OUTCOMES:

- 34 people in 6 months
- 6 IST
- 1 did not engage
- All housed
- Process of establishing a house for IST in community



FLEXIBLE HOUSING POOL JAIL DIVERSION

GETTING A SEAT AT THE TABLE WITH STATE FUNDING

Front door access to housing criminal justice system

Misdemeanor clients diverted into housing using Flexible Housing Pool Model

Clients were given property manager, case manager, and support from Public Defender Social Worker and Court



OUTCOMES

46 beds

46 clients housed


Majority not in HMIS when identified

...so even a minor record can be a life sentence to poverty.

HEAP

- Partnered with Homeless
 Emergency Aid Program (State grant)
- 2 Law Students \$220,000 over two years
- New process with the court, probation and DA
- Waived court administrative fee
- Calendar cases within 2 weeks



OUTCOMES

708 individuals served

Over 3,600 act of services

CHANGING THE FOCUS

Instead of the crime the youth is charge with to.....

the underlying trauma the youth has endured and provide supportive services and

housing to youth and families



GRANT: JUVENILE TRAUMA RESPONSE COURT (JTRC)

- Education Attorney
- Dependency/Delinquency Attorney
- Community Intervention
 Workers
- UC Davis-clinical assessments
- Social Workers





OUTCOMES

This quarter 7/1/21-9/30/21

- 43 youth in the program
- Linked them to services and support
- Improved grades
- Stable housing
- Supported family dynamics
- Collaboration with dual system
- Youth report: safe, supported, not alone



PRE-TRIAL SUPPORT PROJECT

CHANGING THE WAY WE MEET CLIENTS

- Meeting your client in the cage
- 5 seconds to speak to them
- Little to no privacy
- During Court



NEW APPROACH

- Interview them prior to court
- Spend 25-45 minutes with them
- 4 Evidence-based tools to assess housing, mental health, substance use, and trauma
- Call their families
- Coordinate housing
- Help with their animals
- Negotiate their release
- Coordinate their release
- Link to service
- Case management
- Provide CIW



OUTCOMES: LAST 3 MONTHS....

642 individuals assessed

89% needed social worker support

52% need mental health support

44% need substance use and prevention support

48% need housing

3% had medical issues

10% expressed employment and educational needs



OUTCOMES

- 182 had coordinated case plans
- 120 linked to mental health
- 68 linked to substance use and prevention treatment
- 4 connected to educational/employment
- 11 provided other services (DMV, animal support, etc)
- 80 linked to housing
- Less than 3% recidivism
- 41% on average released from custody after gathering information from needs assessment
