4 TYPES OF SUPERVISION:

HOW DO YOU ADDRESS THE INDIVIDUAL NEEDS?

Probation

- Formal Probation
- Supervised by Probation Department

1170(h) Defendants

- Full & Split Sentences
- “Mandatory Supervision” by Probation
- Presumptive splits in January

Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS)

- Released from State Prison and Supervised by Probation

Parolees

- Released from State Prison
- Limitations: Parole Revocations, Warrants, Modifications

NEXT STEP: WE LOOKED TO WHAT WORKED IN THE PAST

- Programming in custody with transition to community is critical

Program
(SB 618)

Local Reentry

Program
(LRP)

- Strong partnership between treatment and probation results in improved outcomes

- Need consistent, well defined, and immediate incentives and sanctions

Drug and Reentry
Courts

- Court involvement is paramount

- Changing behavior and becoming healthy takes time, patience, and persistence

WHERE CAN TREATMENT BE TARGETED: STAGES OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM

- Arrest
- Stabilization in Jail
- Release & Sentencing
 - Return to community with Medication
 - Health Care Act
 - Supervision & Intervention
- Revocation Process: SB 1412 by Senator Nielsen



MENTAL HEALTH SYSTEM

7 programs located countywide, for individuals who are severely mentally ill, providing:

- **Basic Medication Services**
- **Recovery Enhanced Services**
- **Full-Service Partnership**




DIRECTED & COLLABORATIVE APPROACHES


Resentencing Impacts
