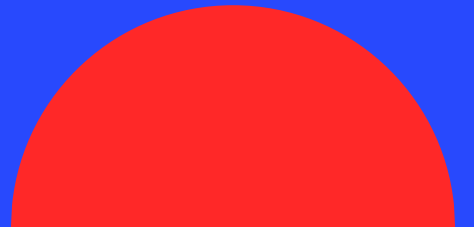
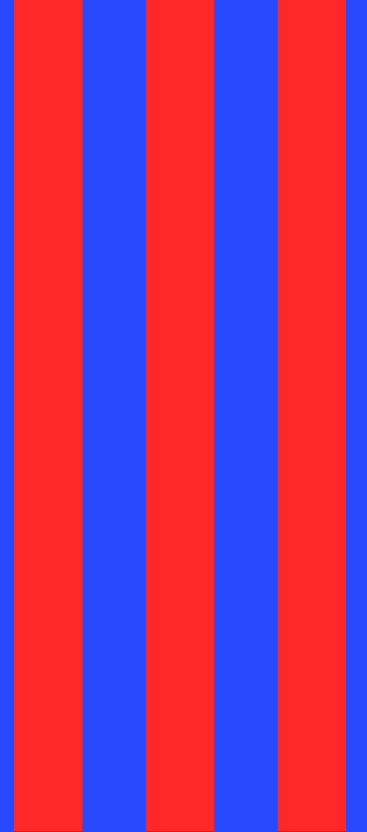

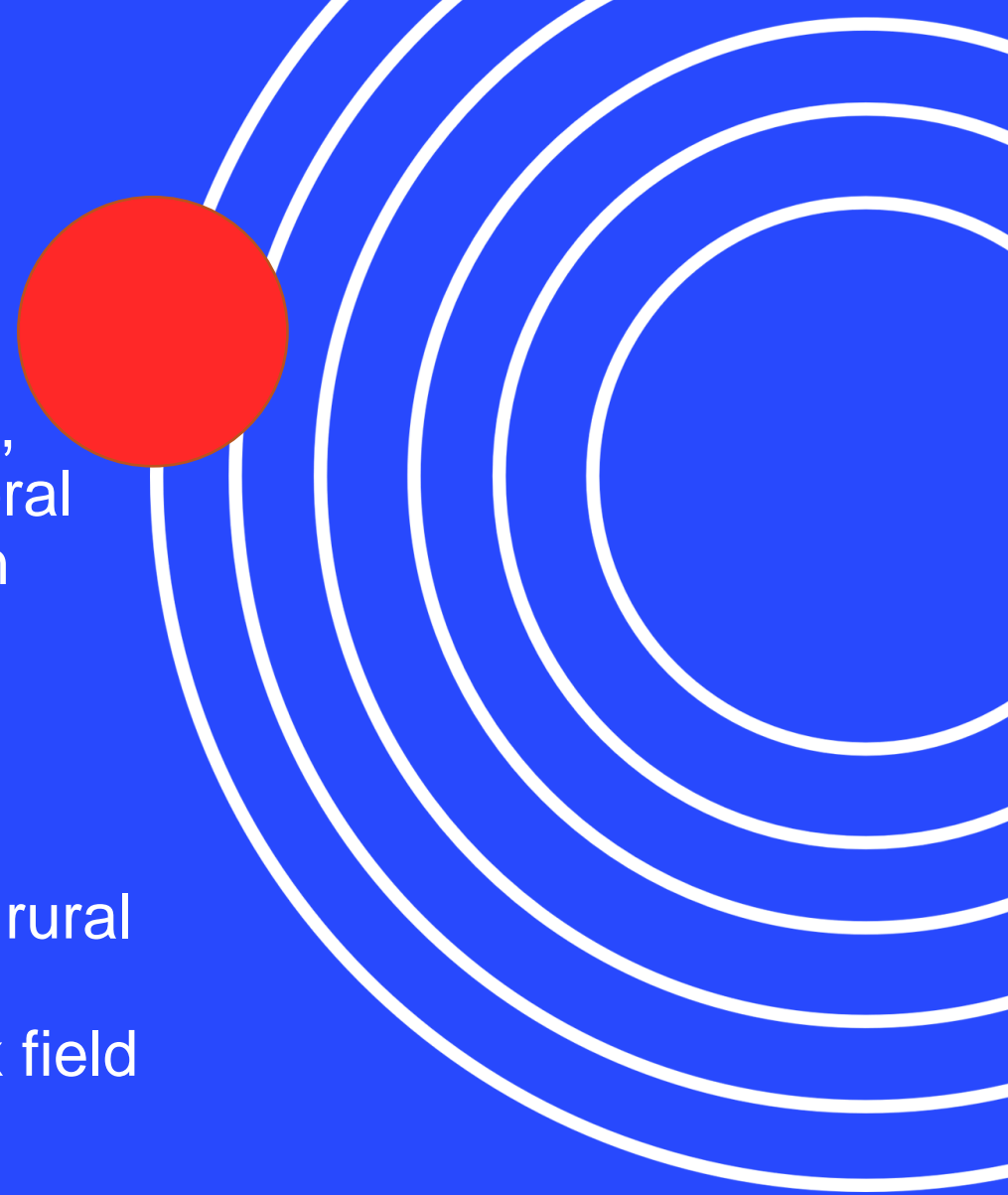
Welcome & Overview

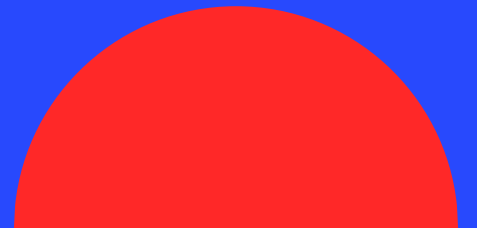
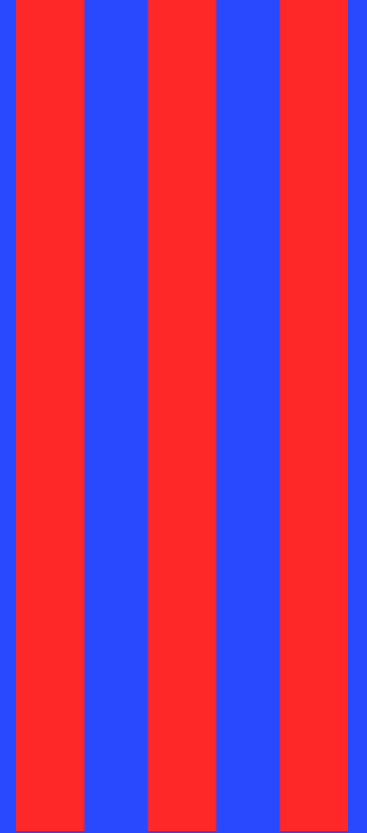
